

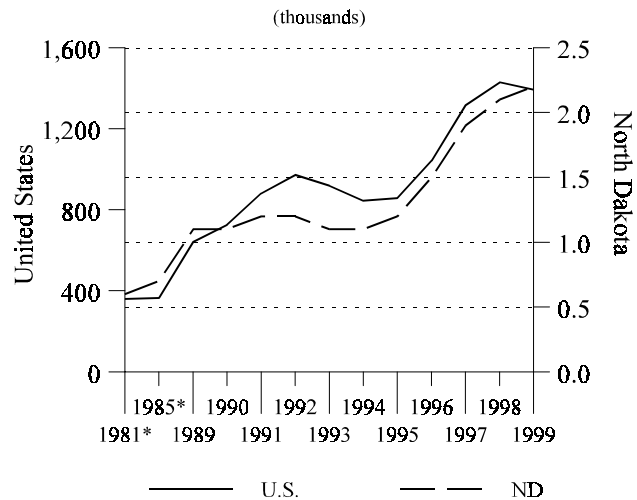
Bankruptcy Cases in North Dakota: 1990 to 1999

In 1999, approximately 2,200 bankruptcy petitions were filed in North Dakota, up from 1,100 in 1990 and up from 600 in 1981.

The number of bankruptcy cases in North Dakota rose 83 percent between 1981 and 1990. Cases rose another 100 percent between 1990 and 1999. On average, bankruptcy cases rose 8.5 percent per year between 1990 and 1999. The nation as a whole averaged 8.2 percent per year since 1990.

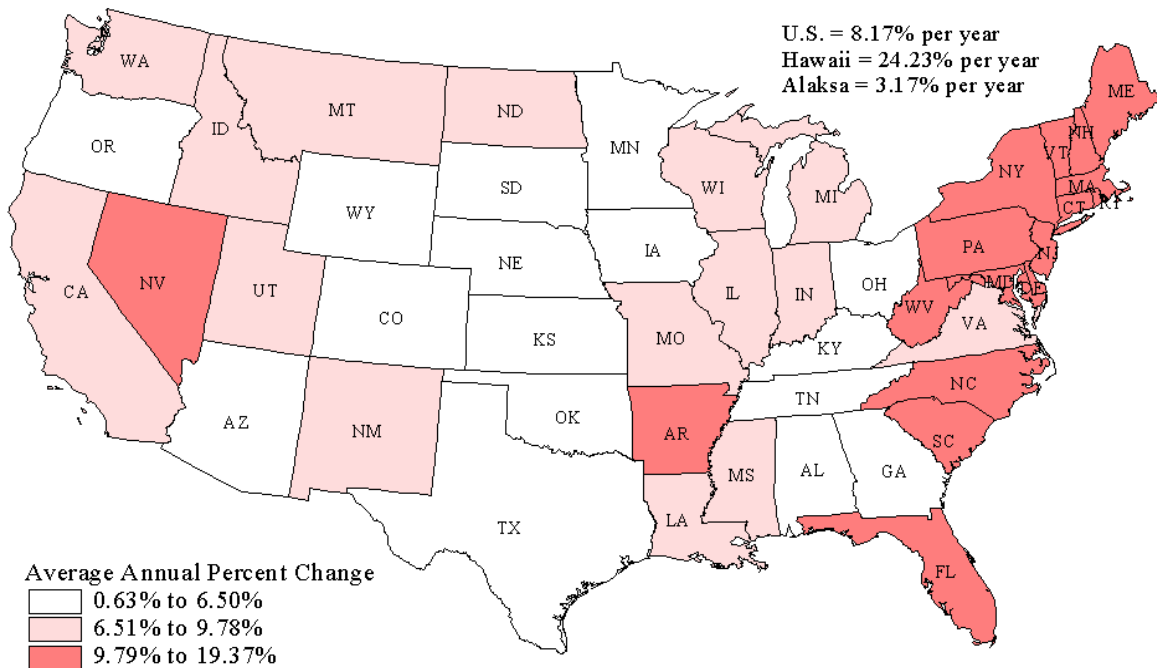
U.S. totals include outlying areas, not shown separately. The numbers in this report cover only bankruptcy cases files under the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978. Bankruptcy is defined as a legal recognition that a company or individual is insolvent and must restructure or liquidate. Petitions 'filed' means the commencement of a proceeding through the presentation of a petition to the clerk of court.
