

Federal Government Expenditures for North Dakota: Fiscal Year 2000

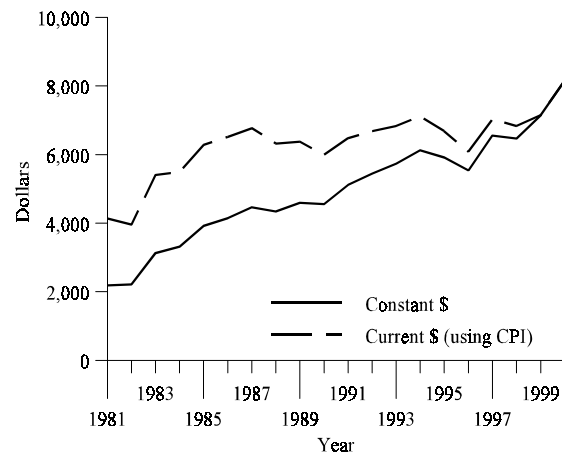
Per capita federal expenditures to North Dakota reached \$8,167 in 2000, up 10.4 percent from 1999 after adjusting for inflation. North Dakota ranked 4th in the nation in per capita federal expenditures in 2000.

Federal dollars to North Dakota totaled \$5.2 billion in 2000, 24.3 percent of which was paid directly to individuals for Federal retirement and disability payments (down slightly from 26.9 percent in 1999). Nearly 40 percent of federal expenditures to North Dakota were categorized as Other Direct Payments. Agricultural program payments captured approximately 50 percent of the ‘other’ federal expenditures or 25 percent of total federal expenditures to North Dakota at \$1.3 billion.

Data for ‘grants’ represent the Federal obligation incurred at the time the grant was awarded. Therefore the amounts do not represent actual expenditures. Also, initial amounts may be adjusted through de-obligations resulting in negative amounts. ‘Procurement’ refers to governmental purchases and contractual outlays. Examples of ‘other’ expenditures include crop insurance, flood insurance, insurance premiums for Federal employee life and health insurance, housing assistance, and student loan programs. Military, postal employee, FBI, and other payroll expenditures are included in the ‘salaries’ category.

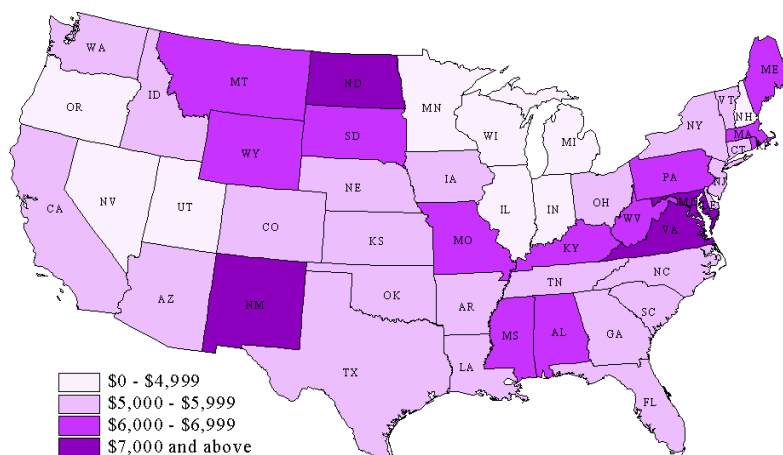
Per Capita Federal Government Expenditures
