

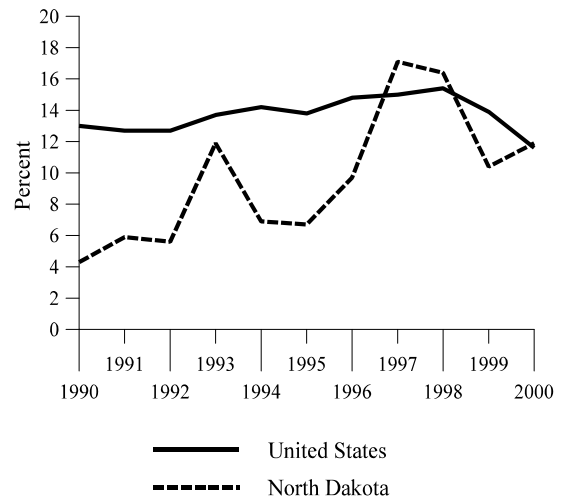
Health Insurance Coverage in North Dakota: 2000

In North Dakota, approximately 89 percent of the population was covered by some type of health insurance in 2000, down from 93.7 percent in 1990. Nationwide, 86.0 percent of the population was covered by health insurance in 2000, down from 86.1 percent in 1990.

The majority of children less than 18 years of age in North Dakota were also covered by health insurance, however, the proportions are declining. In 1990 4.3 percent of children under 18 did not have health insurance. This proportion rose to 11.9 percent in 2000. A steep rise in 1997 was due in part to a definition change which classifies Native Americans with access only to Indian Health Services as uninsured. Nationally, the proportion of children without health insurance declined from 13.0 percent in 1990 to 11.6 percent in 2000.

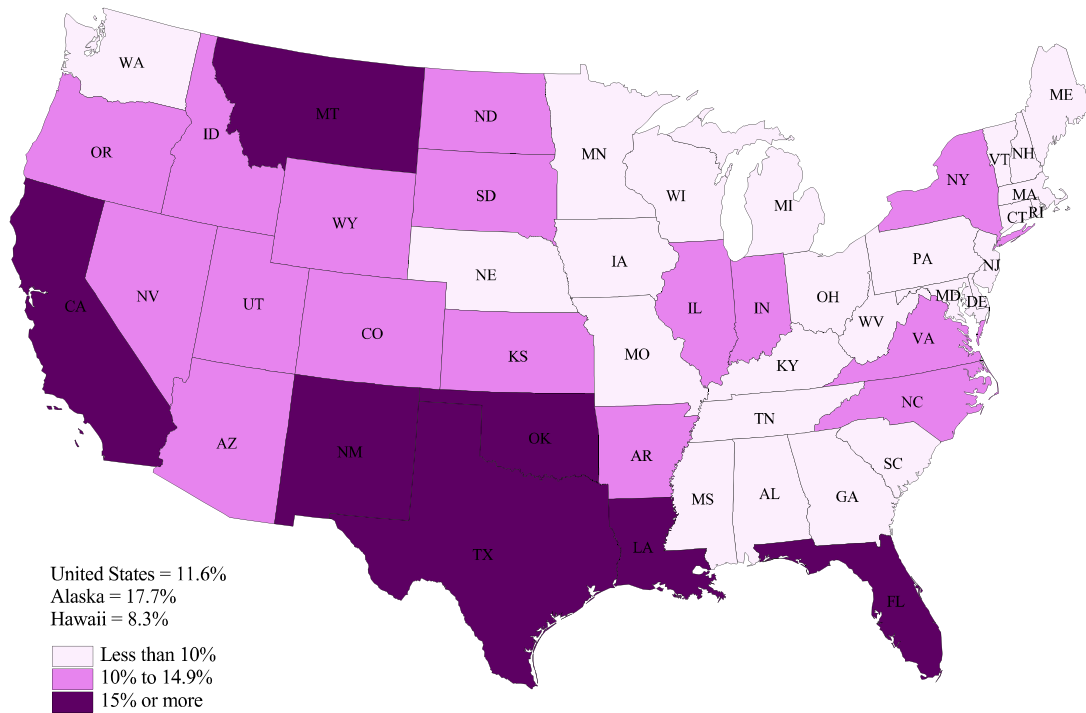
Percent of Children With No Health Insurance
