

Highlights from the 2006 North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book



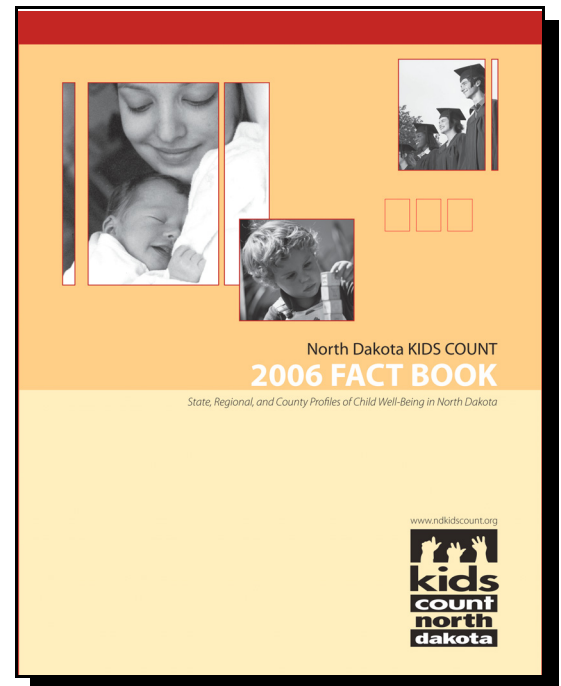
The 2006 *North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book* marks the 12th annual publication produced by the North Dakota KIDS COUNT program, part of a 50-state network founded by the Annie E. Casey Foundation to collect information about the status of children in communities across the United States. Data included in the annual *North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book* cover issues affecting children from birth through adolescence and are widely used by a variety of audiences in planning, needs assessments, and grant writing activities on behalf of North Dakota children. *Fact Book* data offer a road map to better understand the challenges facing North Dakota children in the communities where they live, and quantify the numbers of children affected by respective areas of concern.

The 2006 *North Dakota KIDS COUNT Fact Book* provides state, regional, and county profiles based on seven categories of data representing multiple indicators of child health and well-being. In addition to accessing this full publication online at www.ndkidscount.org, interactive access of North Dakota's indicators are available through the Casey Foundation's CLIKS (Community-Level Information on Kids) website, www.aecf.org/kidscount/cliks. CLIKS offers historical trends, profiles, graphs, maps and rankings for North Dakota, as well as data for other participating states.

North Dakota consistently ranks better than other state averages on many child health and well-being indicators. When compared to other states, North Dakota has the lowest percentage of teens who are high school dropouts, the lowest percentage of teens not attending school and not working, the fourth lowest percentage of children living in single-parent households, the fifth lowest percentage of children living in families where no parent has full-time/year-round employment, and the sixth lowest percentage of low-birthweight babies. The *Fact Book*, however, raises some important issues concerning the well-being of North Dakota's children.

- Despite the fact that three-fourths of North Dakota children live with both parents (75.8 percent), the percentage of children living in single-parent families increased 23.3 percent between 1990 and 2000. This is cause for concern because the poverty rate for North Dakota children living with one parent (39.4 percent) is nearly six times the rate for children living with two parents (6.9 percent).
- In addition to an increase in single-parent families, the number of North Dakota children living with a grandparent rose 48.4 percent between 1990 and 2000 and the number of children in the foster care system rose 17.0 percent between 2000 and 2005. Parental involvement in methamphetamine-related issues is a major reason for the increase of children in foster care, according to the North Dakota Department of Human Services.
- While 4.9 percent of North Dakota children were suspected victims of child abuse or neglect in 2005, the number of children considered to be in high-risk situations, and thus requiring services for abuse or neglect, rose 30.0 percent between 1998 and 2005.
